

Carlos Madrid Álvarez-Piñer (1976), Director of Instituto Cervantes de Manila. Ph.D. Cum Laude in Contemporary History by Universidad Complutense de Madrid. He has conducted research projects about the Philippines and the North Pacific since 1996. Dr. Madrid has given lectures in the University of the Philippines, Keio University of Japan, University of Guam, and in the Diplomatic School of Madrid. He has authored the books *Flames Over Baler* (UPI Press, 2012), *Seráfico* (NCCA, 2012), *Beyond Distances* (Northern Mariana Islands, 2006), and *Belau na Sebangiol* (Instituto Cervantes de Manila, 2005). He was co-founder and editor-in-chief of Filipiniana.net, a division of Vibal Publishing House (2005-2006) and was Academic Coordinator of the Spanish Program for Cultural Cooperation at Instituto Cervantes (2006-2007). He worked in the International Cultural Cooperation at the Ministry of Culture of Spain for two years (2009-2010), where he received training in Cultural Management. Dr. Madrid curated the exhibits *Seráfico. The Franciscan Missionaries in the Aurora region*, on permanent display in Museo de Baler (Aurora Province, Philippines) and the exhibit *Belau na Sebangiol* at the Belau National Museum (2005). Between 1999 and 2001 Dr. Madrid was member of the board of directors of the *Asociación Española de Estudios del Pacífico* and former secretary of its journal, *Revista Española del Pacífico*. In the Northern Mariana Islands, he collaborated with the Museum of Culture, and with the Historic Preservation Office of Guam (2000-2002). He has written different scholar articles and specializes in popularization of history and research.
