



Leasiolagi Dr Malama Meleisea is currently the Director, Centre for Samoan Studies at the National University of Samoa. He (was) a judge of the Samoa Land and Titles Court under the Ministry of Justice and Courts Administration. Leasiolagi has previously been the Director and Associate Professor for Centre for Pacific Studies at Auckland University from 1993-1998. He was also the Foundation Director of the Macmillan Brown Centre for Pacific Studies at the University of Canterbury from 1988-1993 and a Senior Lecturer in Pacific History and Politics at the University of the South Pacific from 1978-1987. Leasiolagi worked in UNESCO for about thirteen years as the UNESCO Regional Adviser for Social and Human Sciences for Asia and the Pacific based in Bangkok and was Director and UNESCO Representative in Afghanistan and Bangladesh.
